The problems drive our purpose.



Education

Persistent gaps in educational attainment by race, income, and geography continue to constrain economic mobility, with degree completion and graduation rates varying sharply across communities and socioeconomic groups.

- **61% of US adults** do not hold a bachelor's degree
- **Nearly 3 in 10 students** who start a 4-year college never graduate
- **College graduation rates for Black (50%) and Native American (52%) students** trail White (77%) and Asian (83%) students
- **Students from low-income neighborhoods** are far less likely to earn a college degree



Food

Persistent food and nutrition insecurity, combined with a modern food environment dominated by ultra-processed foods, continues to drive significant health disparities and limit long-term well-being across communities.

- **60% of US adults** have at least one diet-related disease
- **47 million people**, including **13.8 million children**, live in food-insecure households
- **53% of adults' and 62% of children's** daily calories come from ultra-processed foods
- **30-40% of all US food** produced each year goes uneaten

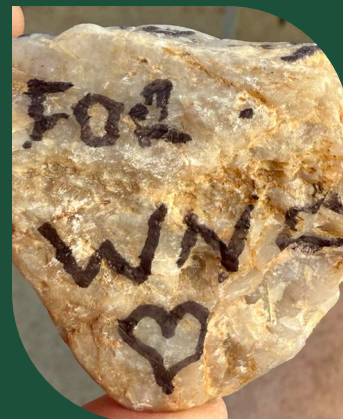
